Congregations connect with ACTS2 by:

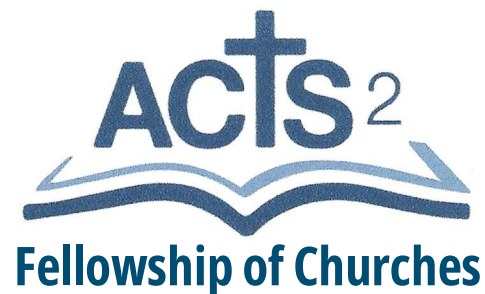
- Affirming our Purpose, Beliefs, and Core Values

- Practicing mutual submission (Ephesians 5:21)
